Guided reading session

You will need

Tune in

Ask children to pick up their books so that they are ready to look at the front cover. Introduce the book by encouraging the children to look closely at the front cover.

Ask: What do you think the book is about?

Ask children to point to the title of the book and then read it aloud to them. Ask them to read it aloud with you.

Turn to the back cover and draw the children's attention to the stars. Explain that this usually tells us what happens in the book or it tries to encourage us to read it. Read the back about, encouraging the children to follow and join in with you.

Ask: Can you imagine if the world was just one colour? What would it look like?

Turn to the title page and ask children to point to where it tells us the name of the author and illustrator. Read it to the children. (Safiah Khatun)

Heads together

Read pages 2 to 5 aloud to the children, asking them to follow as you read and to join in. Model strategies for reading longer words. For example, recognition of tricky words ('what', 'look', 'using phonics strategies and breaking the words down (s-s-a-f-i-a-h)). Focus on pages 4 and 5.

Ask the following questions:

- Can you imagine a world like this?
- What colour are the animals normally?
- Do you think you would like to live in a world that is all one colour?

Read pages 6 to 11 aloud to the children, modelling strategies for reading and asking the children to follow as you read and to join in.

Ask: What do you think the girl is going to do next?

Wrap up

Read page 12 aloud to the children, asking them to follow as you read and to join in.

Ask the following questions:

- What painting might she draw on that empty piece of paper?
- What would you draw?
- What colour could you use?
- Would you use lots of colours?

Look at pages 14 and 15 together.

Ask: Can you use the pictures to help you to say what the book is about?

Tune in

Explain to the children that in this lesson they are going to look closely at some of the words the author has used and enter these words into the table.

Read the book aloud to the children, asking them to follow and to join in as you read.

Refer back to each of the focus words in the book, writing up the word, giving a child-friendly explanation and asking the children to say the focus word with you. For example, in the book, the girl imagines a different world. If I imagine, I make a picture in my head. Now, say the word with me - 'imagine'.

You may wish to use the examples in the table above.

Refer to each of the focus words that you have written on and give the children the example sentences. Then ask them to interact with the word meanings by asking the questions in the 'Tell me' column. You may wish to demonstrate by giving some examples of your own.
