India's para-athletics star Sumit Antil has cemented his legacy by winning his third consecutive F64 javelin throw gold at the 2025 World Para Athletics Championships held at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi. Battling severe shoulder pain, Antil set a new championship record with a throw of 71.37 meters, surpassing his previous mark of 70.83 meters set in 2023.

India has set a new world record by constructing the highest motorable road at Mig La Pass in Ladakh, reaching an altitude of 19,400 feet above sea level. Developed by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) under Project Himank, the Likaru-Mig La-Fukche road connects the Hanle region to the border village of Fukche near the Line of Actual Control (LAC).

The Philippines has launched the world's first coral larvae cryobank to preserve and restore endangered coral reefs. Located in the Coral Triangle, the facility freezes coral larvae to safeguard genetic diversity for future reef restoration and research.

The Indian Air Force (IAF) celebrated its 93rd Air Force Day on 8 October 2025 at Hindon Air Base with a grand parade, flypast and displays of fighter jets like Rafale, Su-30MKI, MiG-29 and indigenous systems such as Netra AEW&C and Akash missiles. The event highlighted Operation Sindoor, honored IAF personnel for their service, and showcased India's air mobility with aircraft like C-17 Globemaster III.

Union Minister, Shri Amit Shah inaugurated India's first cooperative multi-feed Compressed Biogas (CBG) plant at Maharshi Shankarrao Kolhe Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana in Kopergaon, Maharashtra. The plant will produce 12 tons of CBG daily and 75 tons of potash from jaggery, reducing imports and promoting a circular economy in sugar mills.

The Indian Navy and Royal Navy of the United Kingdom launched Exercise KONKAN-2025 on 5 October off India's western coast. Scheduled from 5-12 October, the exercise includes a harbour phase with professional interactions and cultural exchanges, and a sea phase with anti-air, anti-surface, and anti-submarine drills.

Poland has signed a deal to link its national fuel pipeline with NATO's Central Europe Pipeline System (CEPS), in a project worth 20 billion zlotys. About 300 km of pipeline will be built from the German border to Bydgoszcz, along with new fuel storage facilities for NATO operations.

The 11th World Green Economy Summit was held in Dubai, bringing together over 3,300 participants from more than 30 countries. This year's theme was "Innovating for Impact: Accelerating the Future of the Green Economy." Co-hosted with WETEX 2025, the summit focused on renewable energy and sustainable technologies.



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
